# **Proposed Change to NIFRS Crewing Arrangements**



### **Current Crewing Systems**

- Wholetime Full time firefighters available 24/7
- Retained Part time firefighters who respond from home/work
- Variable Full time firefighters available 12hrs/day all week




# 67 Fire Stations across Northern Ireland

7 Variable Crewed	1 appliance - full time firefighters 12 hrs/day & part time firefighters 12 hrs/day 1 appliance - part time firefighters		
45 Retained	1 or 2 appliances – part time firefighters		
1 Volunteer (Rathlin)			


69.33% of Northern Ireland/36.99% of population is covered by Retained stations








### In 2015 NIFRS responded to 22,352 emergency incidents








# **Measuring the Risk**:

### Impact of Dwelling Fires over the past 5 years




#### **1983** Casualties

3,190 RTCs attended 2010/11 to 2014/15


RTCs increased by 13%

### **67 Station Areas Risk Scored**

5 Risk Bands: Very High to Very Low

Crewing and appliances are generally in line with Risk Bands

Risk Band	Appliances and Crewing
Very High	2 pump Wholetime stations
High	2 pump Wholetime/Retained stations
Medium	2 pump Variable Crewed stations & 2 pump Retained Stations
Low	2 Pump Retained Stations
Very Low	1 Pump Retained Stations

# **Proposed Day Crewing System**

Single Watch system with Firefighters required to work a 42 hour week in line with other NIFRS Wholetime shift patterns within a 50 hour 5 day week pattern

0800 - 1800hrs				0800 - 1800hrs		Rotary Day Off	




# **Benefits of Day Crewing**

- Further improves spread of Wholetime in NI faster response
- Release of resources to areas of similar risk
- Cost effective and efficient model
- Adequately resourced reduced reliance on overtime
- Hours determined in line with Retained availability
- Hours determined to avoid heavy traffic for RDS
- Maximise community engagement to benefit public
- Maximise firefighter safety Risk Critical Information (RCI)
