Background to Hub

- Concept 2015 than modified by 2017 to include Community input
- Community full consultation Q1 2018, (see later)
- Planning permission received, started to raise monies.
- Applied for grants from various bodies. No success.
- Meetings with Arlene Foster & Paul Kennedy in 2018. (Stormont not meeting)
- Further meetings Arlene and Deirdre Hargey in mid 2021. (delayed Covid).
- Eventual follow up with Alison McCullagh, Anne-Marie Campbell and Deborah Erskine in November 2021

Where we are today

- Perceived as a flagship project between the two councils and Department for Communities. General agreement to "split costs" with us.
- All parties offer full written support.
- Project is "ready to break ground". Tender documents are available.
- As a Community we are stuck in limbo. We have raised monies, (£85k to date), but need seed funding to be able to start construction.
- Costs continue to increase. (£50k in last year alone)
- We need financial assistance please? The whole Community will benefit.

Community Consultation

- 338 responses representing 1252 persons, approx. 10% of Clogher Valley population. Average age range 16-78.
- Greater than 70% were from Mid Ulster area.
- 99.4% felt there was a need for investment in a Community facility
- Some relevant comments:
 - "There is no meeting place in the local community that is not related to religion in some way"
 - "CVRFC presently do some great Community and charity work across all parts of the community. They help to bring families, generations and communities together. They do this whilst the current facilities at the Cran are not good enough. They need a space to allow the Community to congregate, meet, socialise and exercise".
 - "Good positive vibes around the club where everyone is welcome no matter what age or what background they are from. So much more could be achieved if the space and facilities could be upgraded to accommodate the obvious needs of the wider community"

 - A summary of grant aid received



Proposed floor plan



How do we hope to raise capital?

Raise the money through:
- Application to Mid Ulster district council

Application to Fermanagh and Omagh district council
Application to NIE Department of Communities.
Other grant applications. (no capital grants at present....anywhere)
Fund raising within CVRFC and local community. (£85k in place today)
Investigating further loans Community Finance Ireland etc. (As non profit difficult to meet repayments schedule)

Fund raising now stopped as the community wants to see progress "on the ground"
