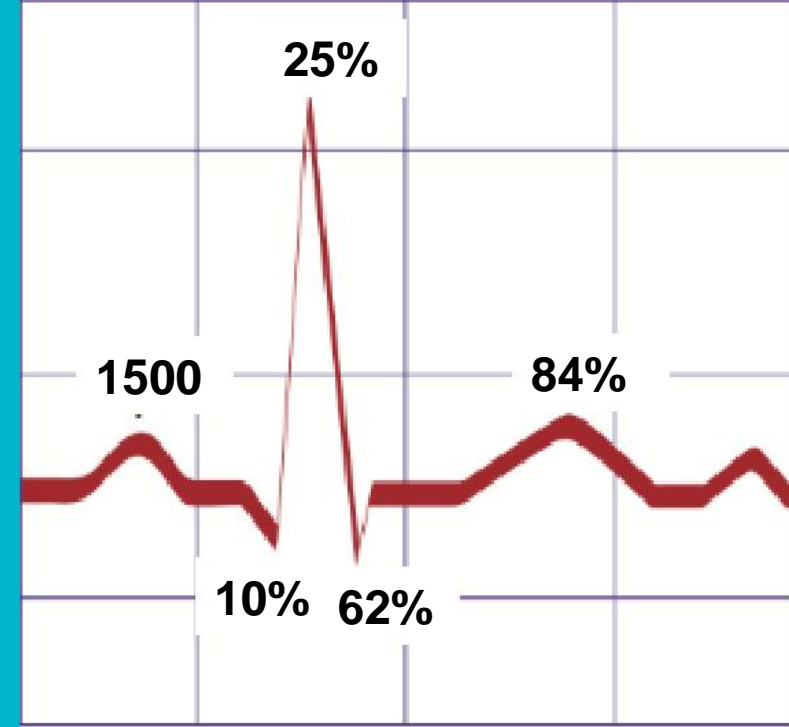

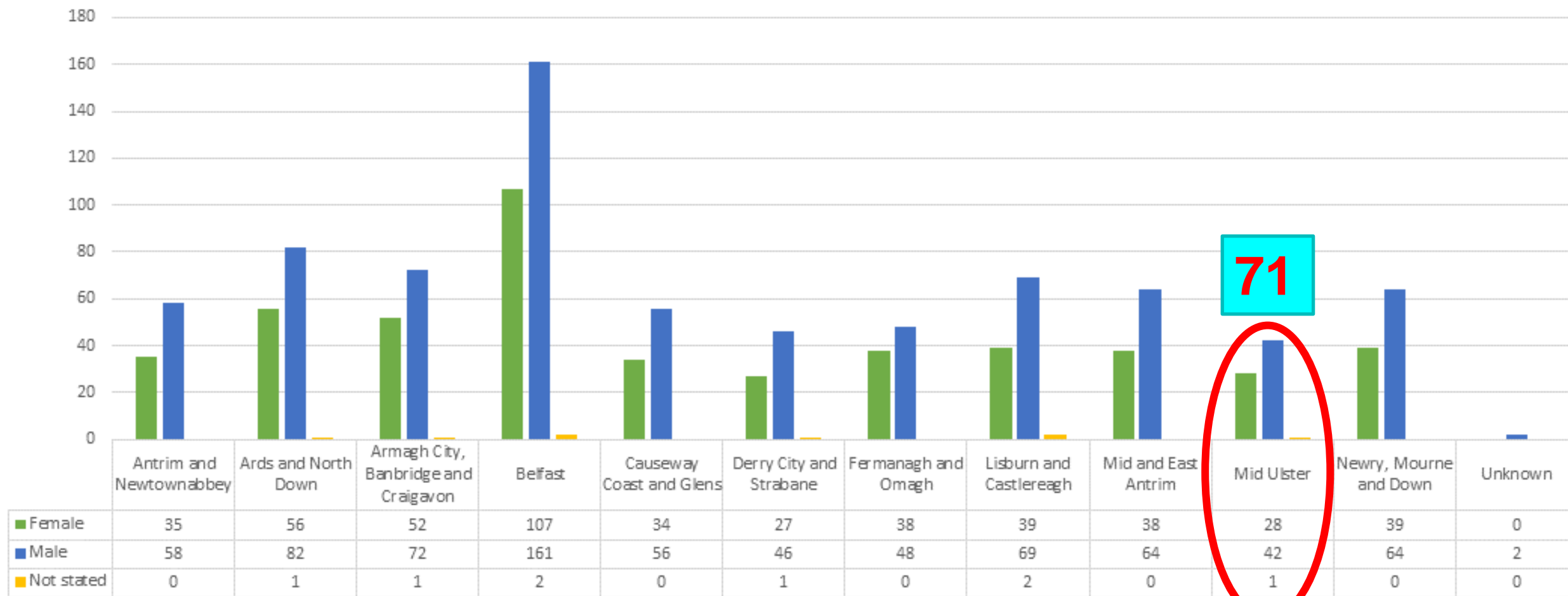

- 63 road deaths

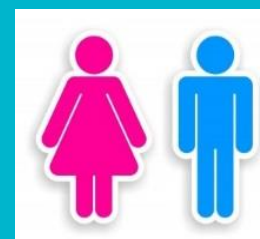
Cardiac Arrest Jan-Aug 2017: Super Council Location

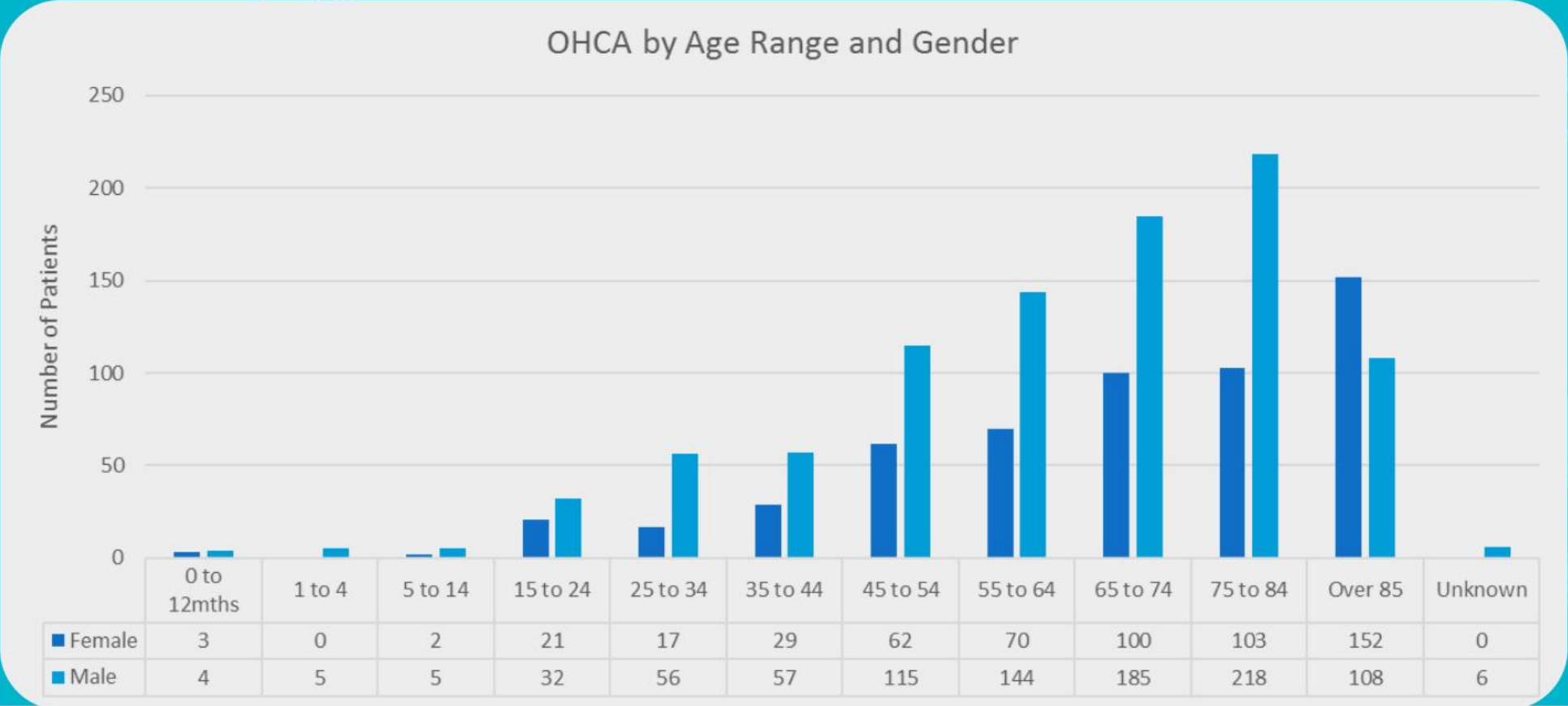

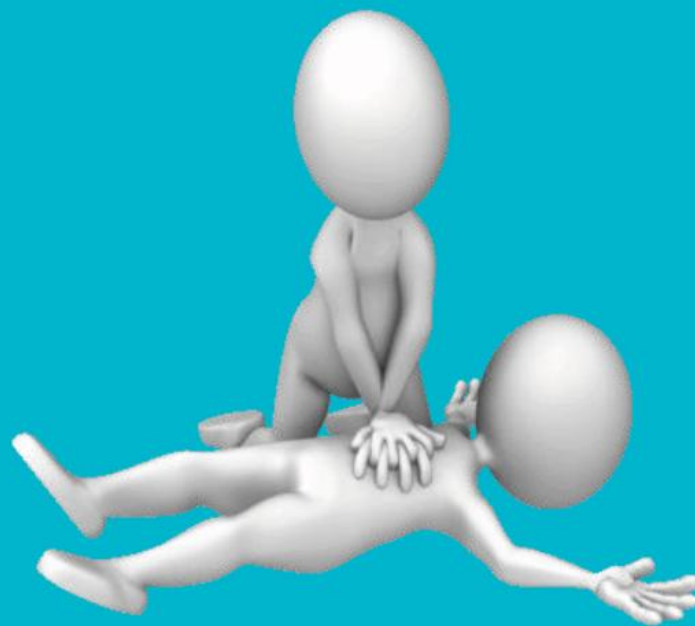
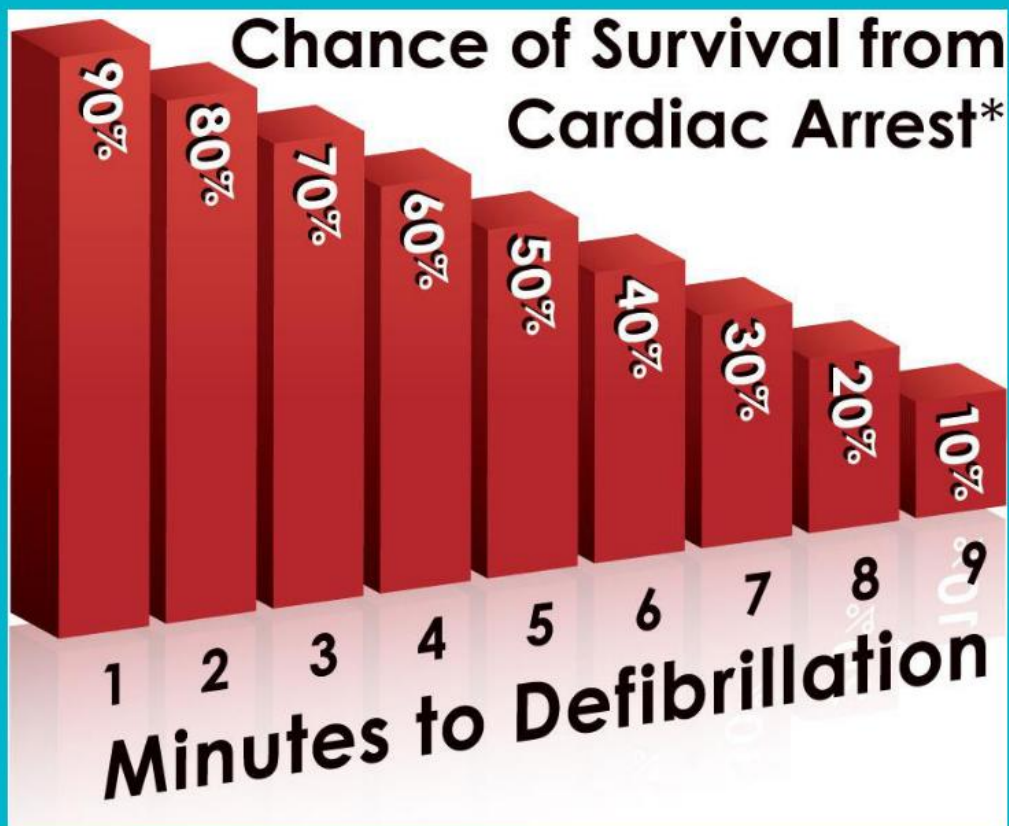
A recognised national trend identifies a greater risk of cardiac arrest for patients greater than 65 years, with 65 years being the mean age.

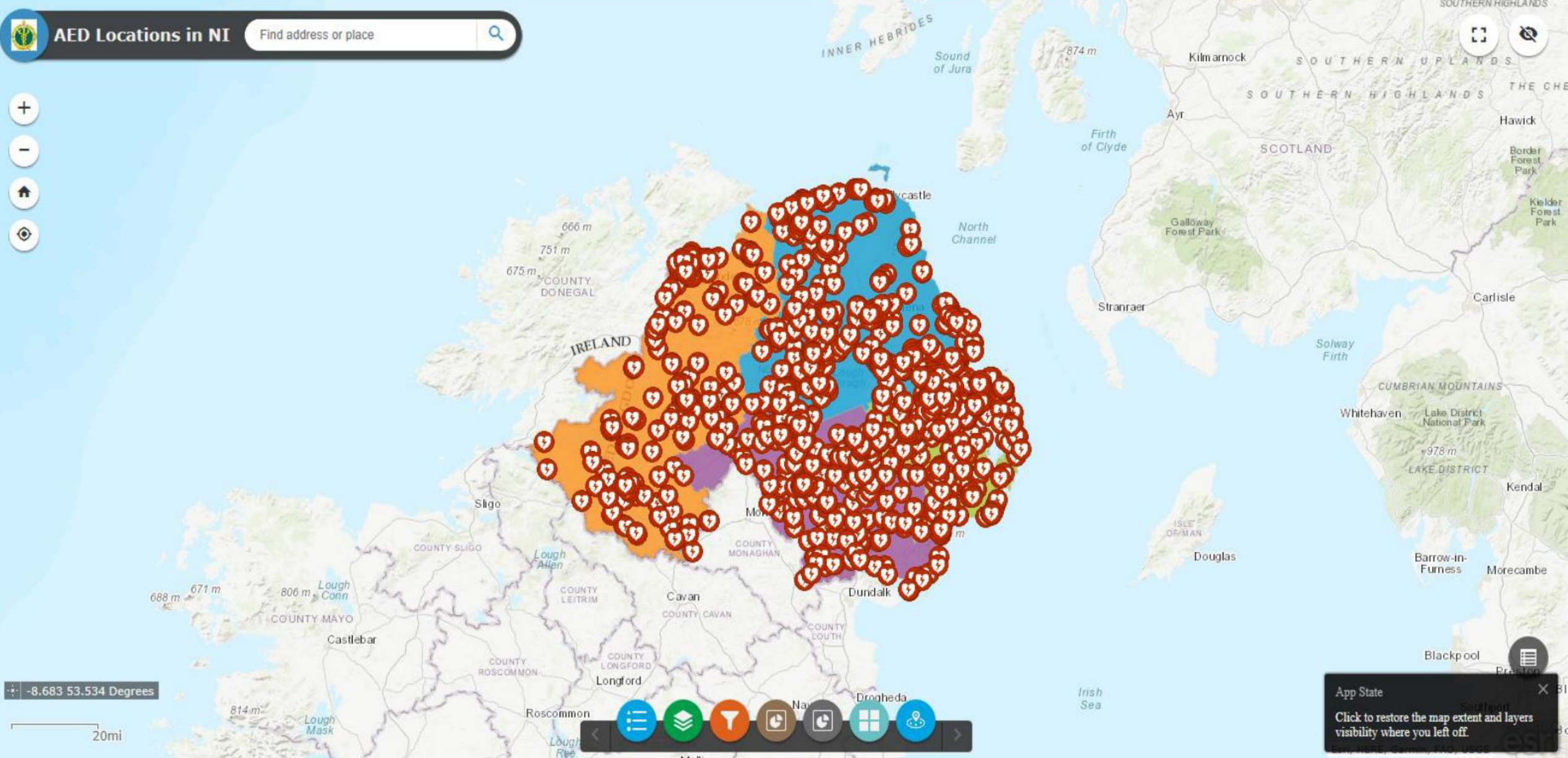
A small number of children and infants are also recorded here. This is an infrequent occurrence and the cause of arrest here is varied and is usually due to trauma or a





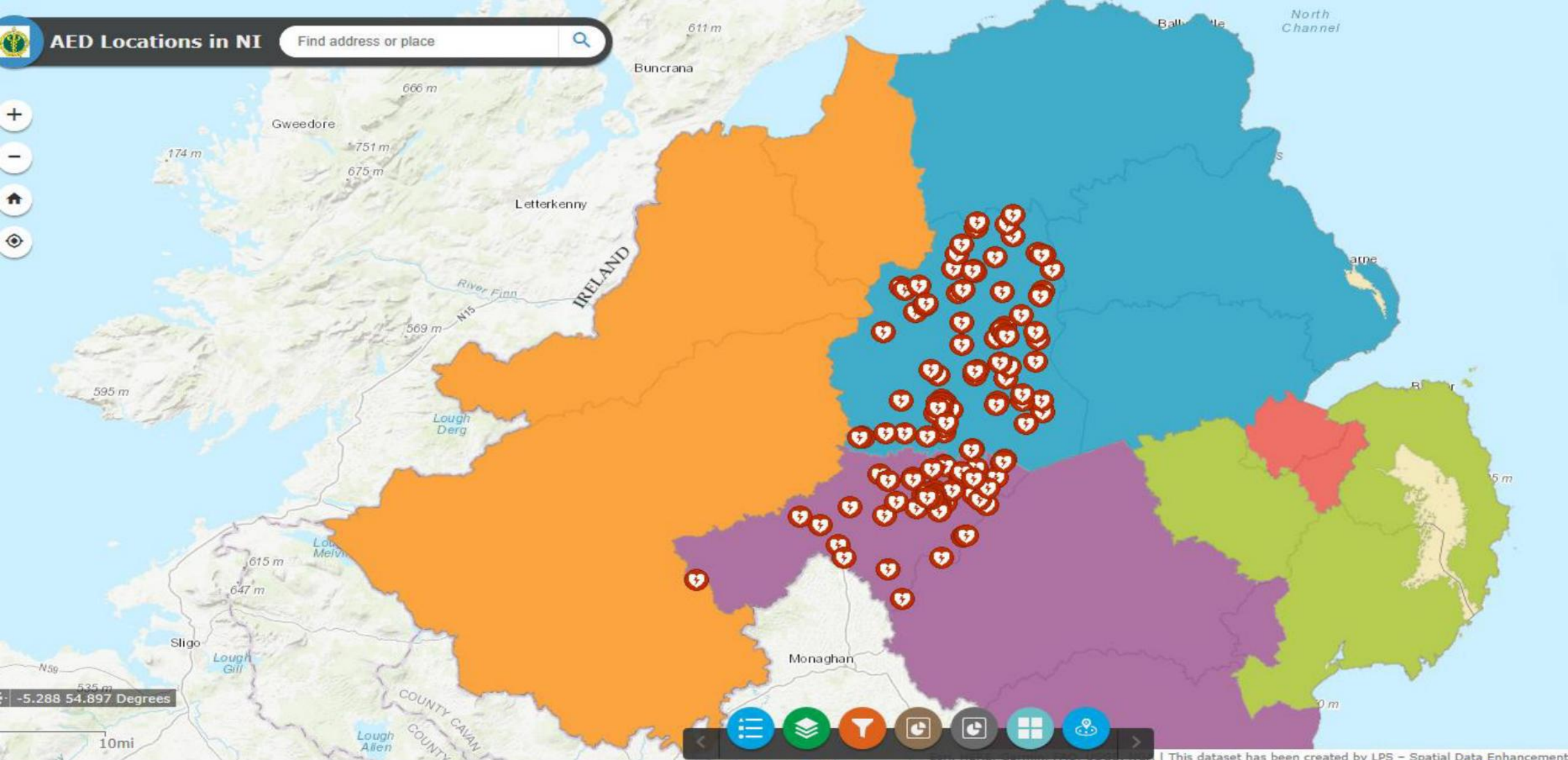
Countries with the highest rates of OHCA survival are those strengthened in all 4 links in the Chain of Survival

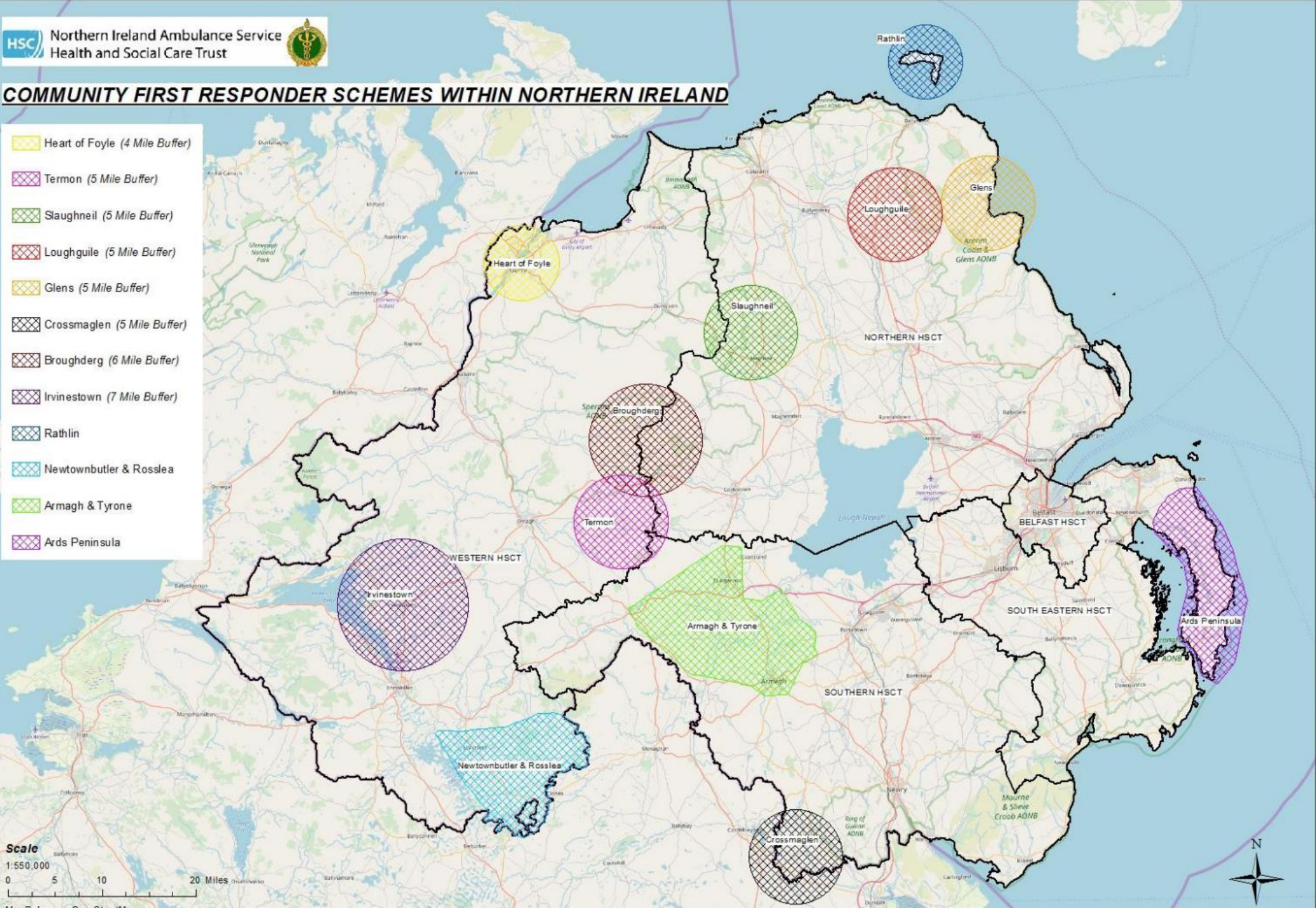

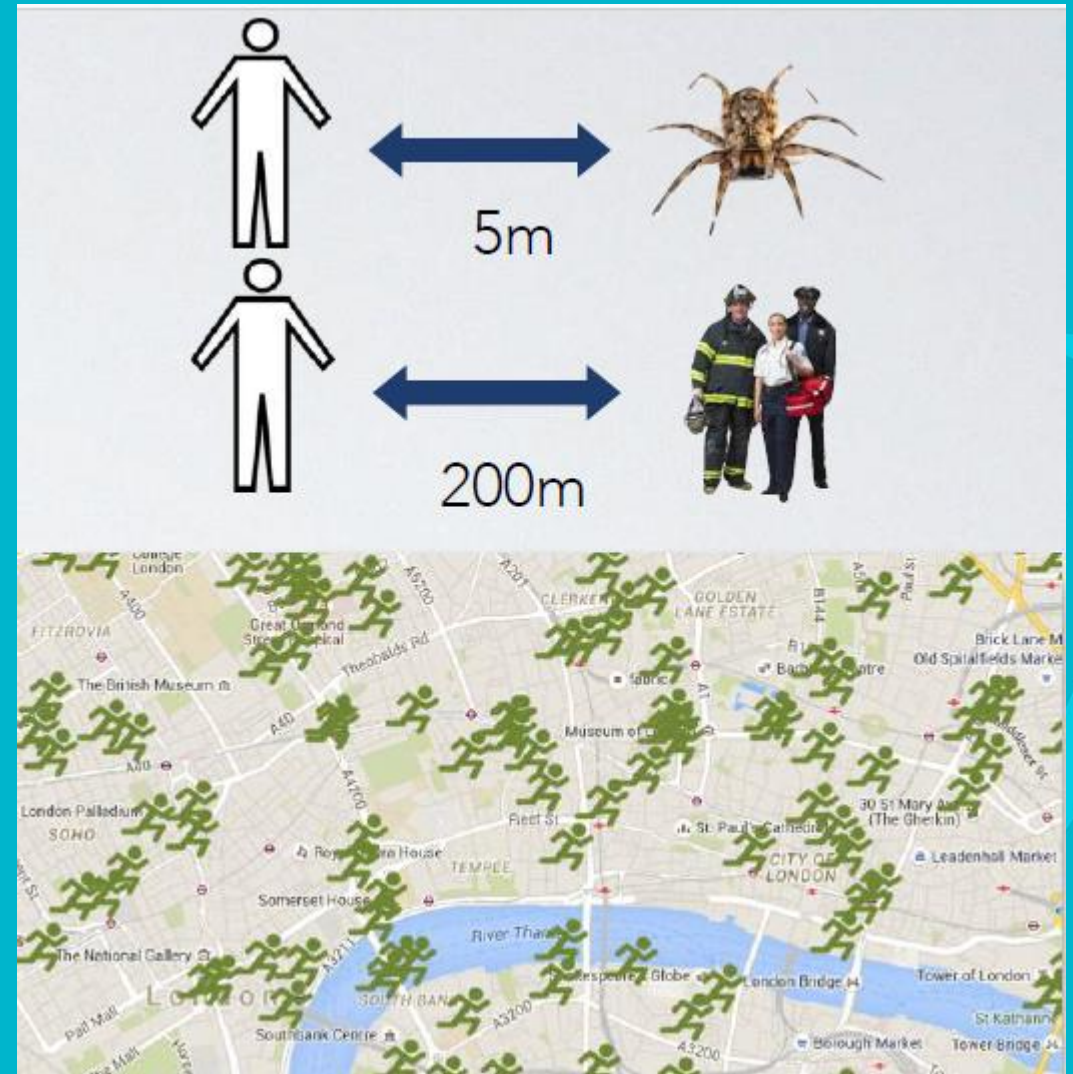
