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Northern Ireland Strategic Migration Partnership

- Provides a regional advisory, developmental and consultative function in relation to migration
- Works across the levels of government in NI, with public, private and third sector stakeholders and with the participation of the 5 main political parties.



Key Objectives

- 1. Act as a conduit for information exchange between the Home Office, NI Assembly, councils and regional and national partners/organisations
- 2. Facilitate communication, coordination and partnership working across localities and service providers
- 3. Support partners/ agencies to develop a coordinated and strategic approach to migration
- 4. Support partners to better understand their migrant populations, their rights and entitlements
- Support partners' participation in schemes to provide humanitarian protection
- 6. Work with partners to promote the identification and prevention of abuse of the migration system in NI

Key Achievements to Date include:

- Mapping exercise to understand patterns of **deployment of migrant workers** across Northern Ireland.
- Report to assess effectiveness of **employment rights protection** for migrant workers from enforcement and support agency viewpoint; continued collaboration with agencies to develop models for improved identification and intelligence sharing.
- Impact report mapping the challenges faced by schools in meeting the needs of young migrants with interrupted experiences of formal education; continued collaboration with DEL to progress recommendations
- Production of distinct profiles of the migrant communities within each of the 11 new super-council areas - to inform council strategy and planning.
- Rationale and draft action plan for a Regional Approach to Migration that has positively influenced the (draft) Racial Equality Strategy
- Rationale and draft action plan for a Refugee Integration Strategy that has positively influenced the (draft) Racial Equality Strategy.



Mid-Ulster Profile

- 6.4% of the population born outside UK or Ireland (NI average = 4.5%)
- 7,159 residents speak a language other than English or Irish as their main language, 36% of whom cannot speak English, or cannot speak it well
- Number of requests for NIHSC interpreting service increased by 262% in 7 years from Southern HSCT
- 135% increase in number of newcomer pupils between 2007 – 13


