

































Policy Fit and Alignment

This adds value to the work of the 8 member Councils and of both governments


It sits within an international framework, to which the UK and Ireland are committed

Regional Priorities


Exploiting new opportunities based on regional strengths and territorial natural assets;


Supporting economic development through adequate industrial spaces, inter-firm collaboration/innovation and links with education;

Enhancing citizens' quality of life, through modes of service delivery, life-long progression opportunities and community amenities;

Enabling greater connected / remote working, through infrastructure and a network of digital hubs in towns and villages; and

Developing the region's tourism offering, through connected greenway and blueway networks, and improved regional connectivity.





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Policy Trajectory

- an increased emphasis on potential (rather than deficits), soft (as well as hard) infrastructure and quality-of-life factors;
- application of economic development based on sustainable development principles and with an emphasis on community well-being;
- increased territorial differentiation (avoidance of a one-size-fits-all approach);
- greater participation by local actors;
- investments (rather than subsidies);
- more systematic institutional collaboration including on a cross-border / inter-jurisdictional basis.

Catalyst 1: Farm to Fork

Concept: strengthening / transitioning the region's strong agriculture base incl. major food producers, organic farms, centres of excellence, food initiatives, through stakeholder collaborations and food tourism initiatives etc.

Key Stakeholders: Govt Depts, Bord Bi, Bord Failte, Tourism NI, Tourism Ireland, Organic Trust Rol, Soil Association NI, Hotelier and Hospitality Associations, SME producers, processors, caterers and food outlets

Next Steps:

- Mapping Exercise
- Networking
- Develop Outline Project Proposal





Catalyst 2: Greenways and Blueways **Concept:** Growing and connecting these vital pieces of infrastructure to promote tourism and active travel

Key Stakeholders: Existing Greenway and Blueway initiatives, Waterways Ireland, Inland Waterways, Govt Depts, member Councils

Next Steps:

Masterplan Map

Continue to engage and network

Catalyst 3: River Catchments Sustainability

Concept: creating liveable places through turning back to river catchments — using nature as an asset, from source to sea, to enhance water quality and to drive crosssectoral projects that will strengthen the region's economic base

Key Stakeholders: Waterways Ireland, Inland Waterways, Govt Depts, member Councils

Next Steps:

- Networking
- Identify priority CBR river catchments
- Engage Relevant Expertise
- Outline Project Proposals (incl. a Catchment Sustainability Plan)



Catalyst 4: Thriving Regional Bioeconomy

- Concept: developing the region as a leader in progressing those strands of the bioeconomy where the area has relevant natural assets, incl. bio technology, bio fuels, and bio energy etc.
- Key Stakeholders: member Councils, Bio Economy SMEs, Experts in the Bioeconomy on the Island of Ireland and internationally
- Next Steps:
 Desk based online Research
 Outreach and networking
 Outline Project Proposal



Concept: to develop a connected and networked set of mountain-biking trails

Capitalising on the region's typography and adding value to the existing suite of visitor attractions, while providing new amenities

Key Stakeholders: Existing mountain bike trail enterprises; member Councils; Govt depts; outdoor recreational agencies

Next Steps:

- Further desk research
- Outreach and learning from exemplar projects in the CBR and internationally
- Outline Project Proposals





Detailed development needed to advance what will be significant project ideas

Project Development Actions



Will require input of key stakeholders including member Councils



Identifying potential funding opportunities speeds up development



Prioritisation needed by the Board in consultation

- 1. Strategic Development Network
- 2. Priority / Project Oversight Groups
- Working with the Board and Council Senior Officers (CSO) forum on implementation
- Tap into regional and national expertise
- Influence investments by governments and others
- Serviced
