- Further develop the capacity of 7 existing social enterprises

- Provide advice guidance and support 68 days
 - 10 Pre-start groups explore business idea 5 days
 - 5 Existing groups develop business plan/new idea 35 days
 - 7 Existing groups increase sustainability and growth 28 days
- Support the creation of a minimum of 4 new jobs
- Lever a minimum of an additional £50,000
- Introduce Groups to Invest NI
- Deliver a Social Enterprise Networking Event


