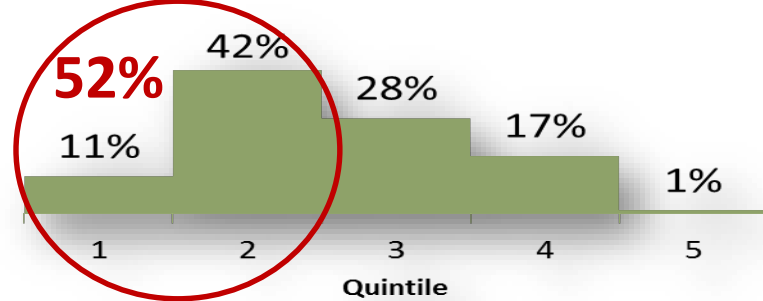

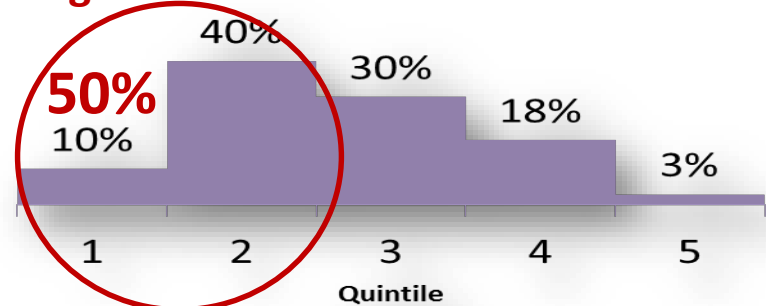

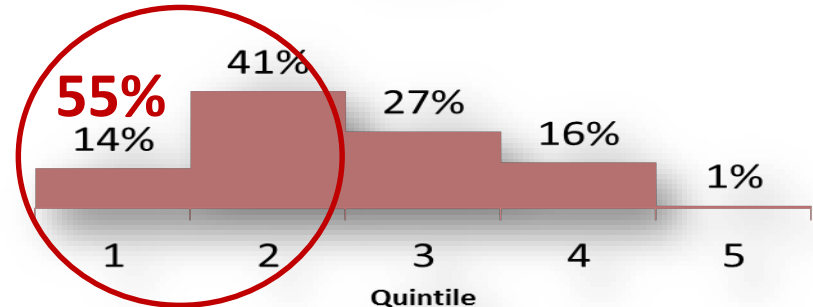

Figure 19: Proportion of regulated enrolments by deprivation quintiles and FE college in 2014/15

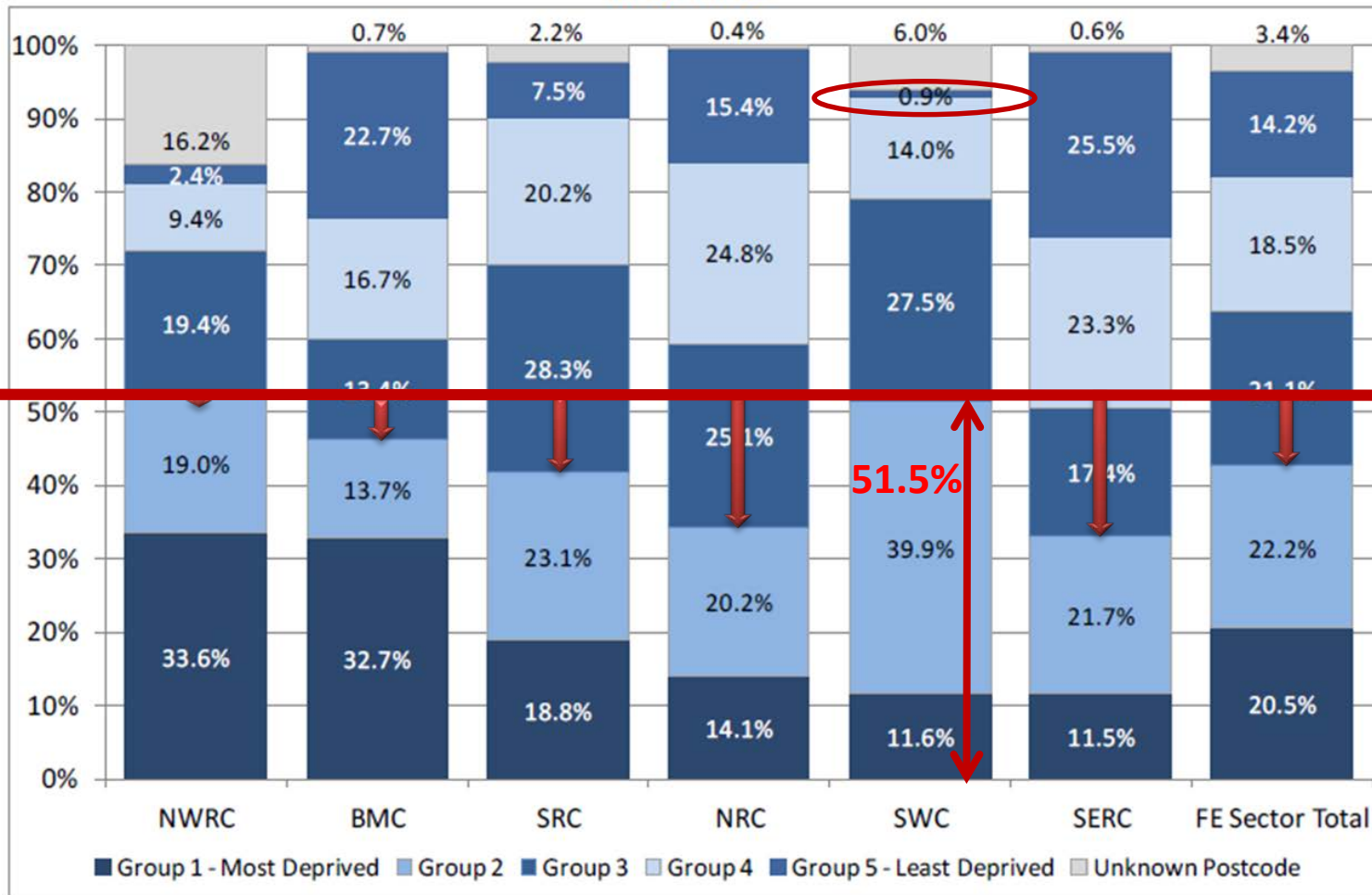


Figure 18: Proportion of regulated enrolments by STEM indicators and FE college in 2014/15

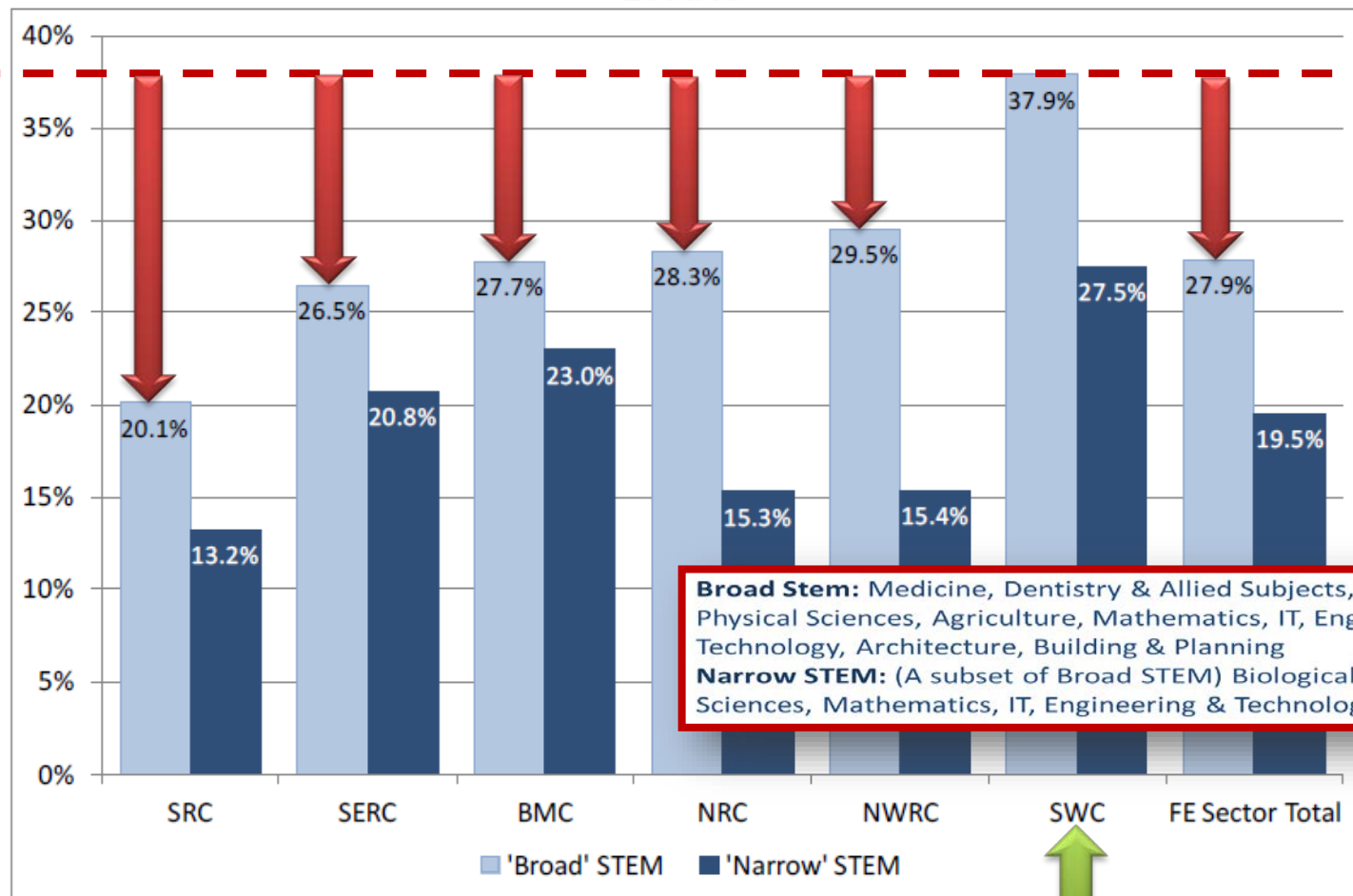


Figure 18: Proportion of regulated enrolments by STEM indicators and FE college in 2014/15

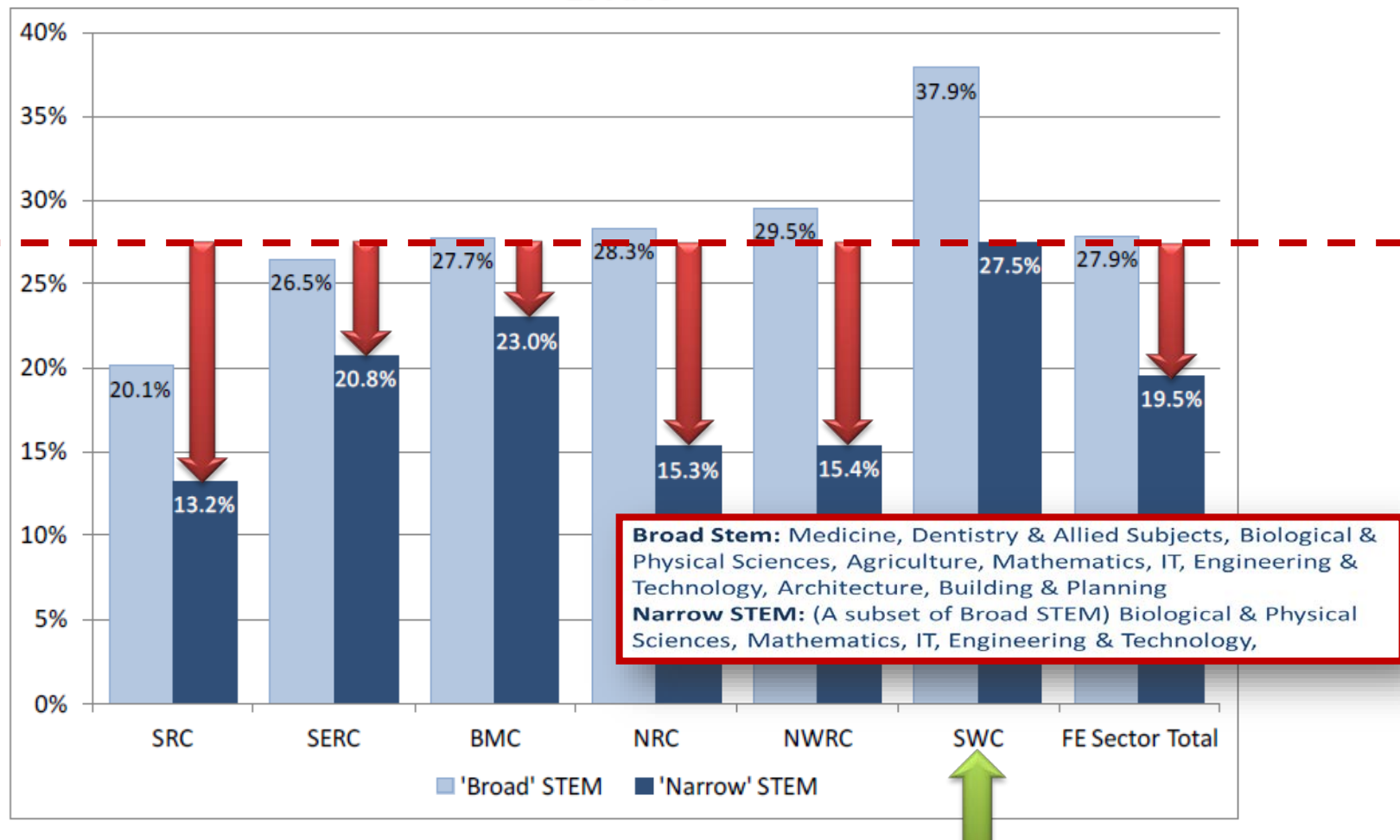

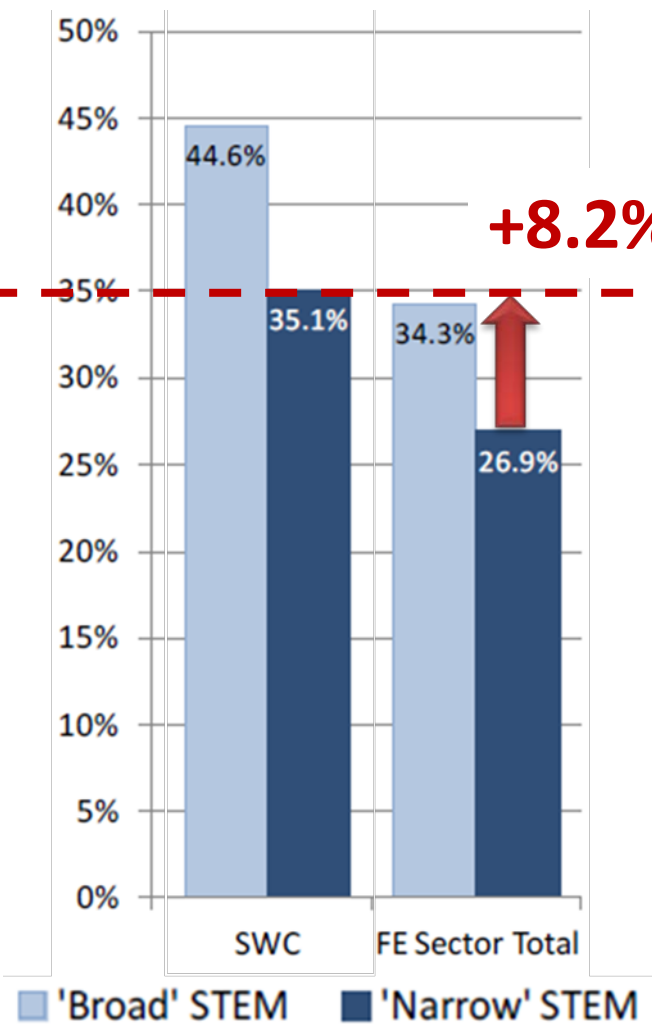

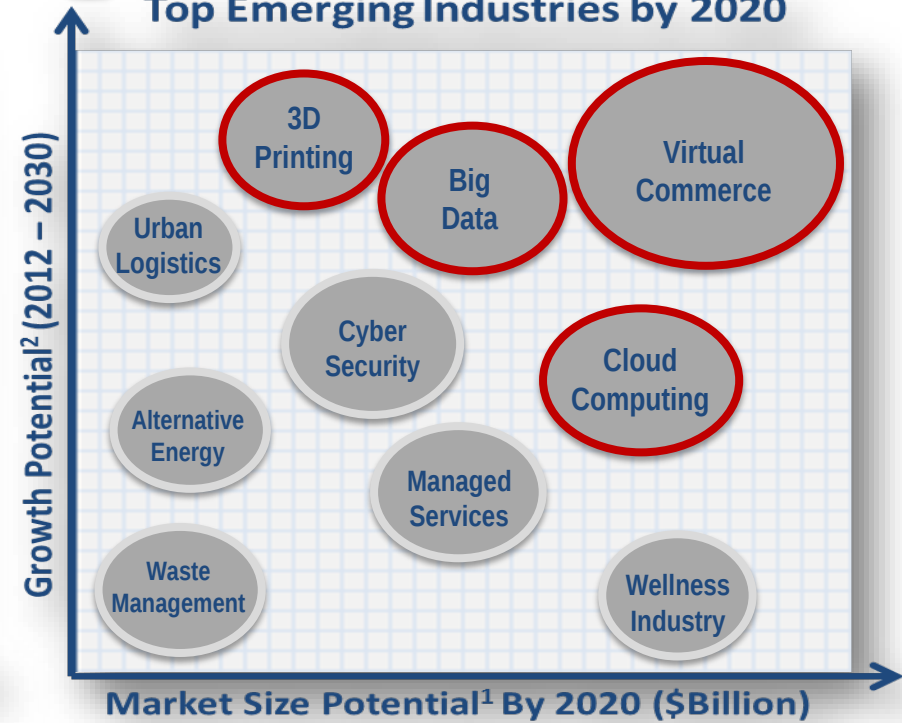
Top Industries of the Future

STEM INDUSTRY BURSARY

Dungannon Borough Council (DBC) in collaboration with South West College (SWC) are offering **FOUR BURSARIES** of £2,500 to students undertaking a Foundation Degree in a STEM related area at SWC. 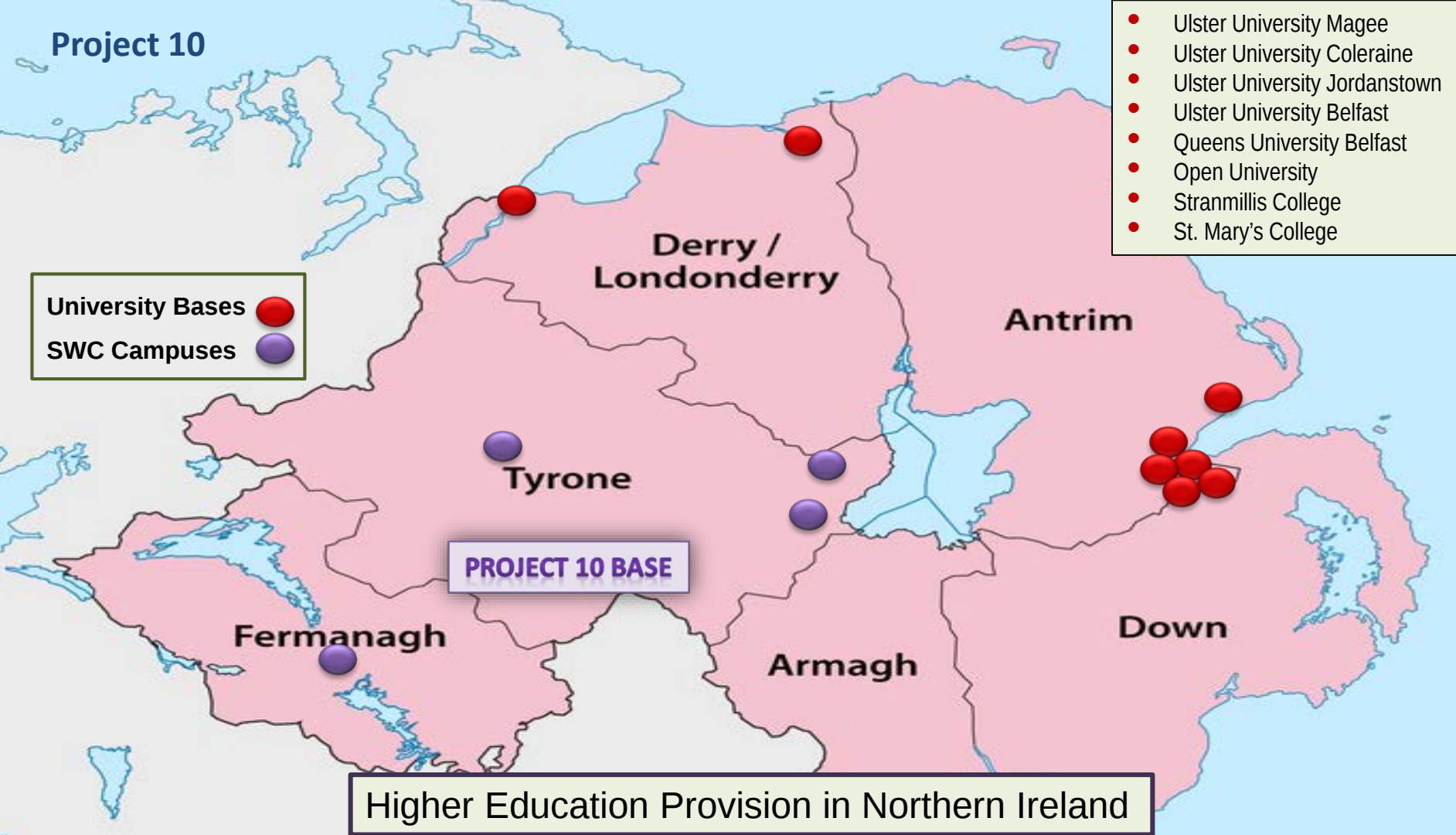


Fig 2 – Geography of South West Region

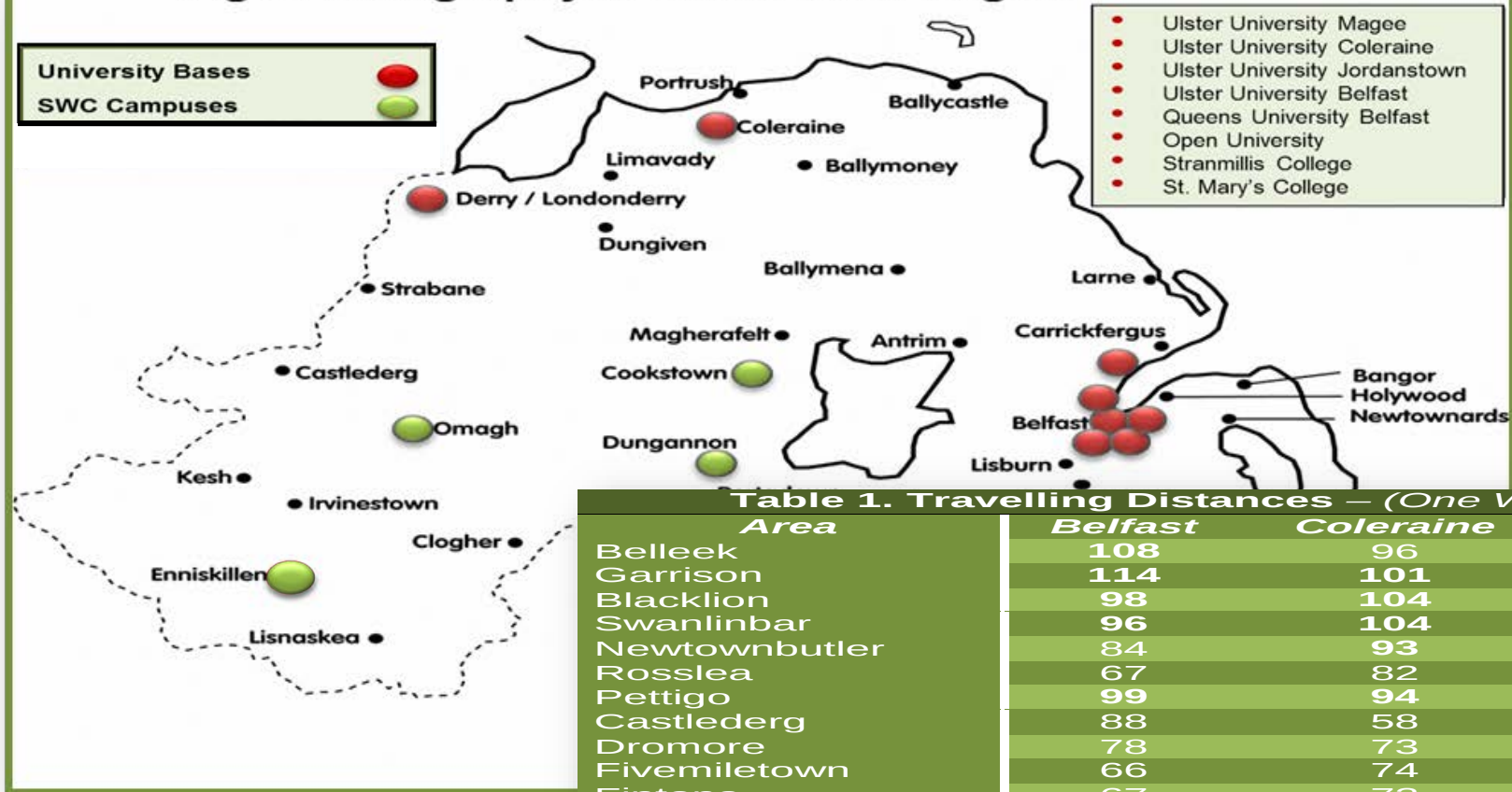
