1 APOLOGIES

Apologies were received on behalf of Councillors Lees, McIvor and McNamee.

2 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Councillor Clarke declared an interest in Davagh Forest with regards to Item 4.

3 REPORT OF DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH & BUILDING CONTROL

A copy of the above report had been previously circulated. The Committee adopted the report together with the following matters contained therein.

3.1 Environmental Health

3.1.1 EU Approval – Allingham Transport, 6 Grange Road, Cookstown, BT80 8SB (Approval No. UK ZT 021 EC)

The Committee RECOMMENDED that the premises known as Allingham Transport, 6 Grange Road, Cookstown, BT80 8SB are issued with a Conditional Approval – No. UK ZT 021 EC, under the above Regulations.

3.1.2 The Pollution Control and Local Government (NI) Order 1978 – Article 66 (1) Ruinous and Dilapidated Buildings – 89 Main Street, Pomeroy, Co Tyrone

The Committee RECOMMENDED that in the event of non-compliance with the Article 66 (1) Notice issued under the above legislation, Council proceeds with the instigation of formal actions in this matter.

3.1.3 Derelict/Dangerous Structure (Shed), at Gortalowry Park, Cookstown

The Committee RECOMMENDED that in the event of noncompliance with the Statutory Notices, that Council proceed with formal action in regards to same.

3.1.4 Derelict Site – Old Rectory Development, Cookstown

The Committee RECOMMENDED that an Article 66 (1) Notice for Ruinous and Dilapidated Buildings is issued under the Pollution Control and Local Government (NI) Order 1978, to the owner of the site to clear waste materials and secure the site.

3.1.5 Pre-application Planning Enquiry (I/2013/0358/F) Dorvil Wind Farm – Background Noise Measurements

The Committee AGREED that the Director of Environmental Health & Building Control provides Members with a technical summary of Council's background noise measurement assessment regarding the above proposed wind farm, at a future PR&S Meeting.

3.1.6 Litter (Northern Ireland) Order 1994 – Littering Offences at Cloughfin Road, Cookstown

The Committee RECOMMENDED that Council proceed with formal actions for contraventions of the Litter (Northern Ireland) Order 1994, in regards to the above matters and that a prosecution file be forwarded to Council's solicitors in reference to same.

3.1.7 Mid Ulster – Affordable Warmth Programme 2014/2015

The Committee RECOMMENDED that Council continue to deliver the above scheme as agreed for period September 2014 to March 2015 using temporary surveyor staff, a Programme Coordinator and Administrative Support and fees for Building Control approvals are processed as per the arrangements for 2013/2014.

3.1.8 Mid Ulster Affordable Warmth Programme – 2014/2015 – Tender for Vehicles

The Committee RECOMMENDED that Council proceed with the tender process and seek quotations for the purchase of two vans, based on the specification outlined below:

- 75 brake horse power diesel (Minimum)
- Side loading and rear loading capabilities
- Fitted Bulk Head/Blue Tooth
- Rubber Mats/Flaps

The Committee RECOMMENDED that Council facilitates the issue of 10 Street Trading Licenses on Christmas Eve, as per previous arrangements.

3.1.13 Overcrowding on School Buses

The Director of Environment Health & Building Control advised that he received a letter of response from the Department of the Environment regarding School Transport – Public Safety, which was circulated prior to the meeting.

The Committee RECOMMENDED that the Director of Environmental Health & Building Control invite representatives from the Department of the Environment to attend a future meeting to discuss the issue of overcrowding on school buses with Members.

3.1.14 Noise Assessment

The Committee RECOMMENDED that the Director of Environmental Health & Building Control circulate the report from an active noise assessment, which is being carried out on a wind

turbine located on the Glencussy Road, Cookstown at a future PR&S Meeting.

4.1 Fleet Fuel Management

The Committee RECOMMENDED that Council procure a new fully self-contained packaged fuel station, including suitable fuel management software solution and decommission the existing depot fuel infrastructure as matter of urgency.

4.2 Proposed Solar Photovoltaic (PV) Scheme

On the proposal of Councillor McGarvey, seconded by Councillor Mallaghan the Committee RECOMMENDED that a planning application be prepared and submitted for the proposed solar generation scheme at Magherglass landfill site at a cost of approximately £5,000.

4.3 Contract for the Treatment and Recovery/Recycling of Residual Civic Amenity Site Waste.

On the proposal of Councillor McGarvey, seconded by Councillor Clarke the Committee RECOMMENDED that the contract with RecyCo for the treatment and recovery/recycling of residual civic amenity waste be extended up to 31 March 2015 at a revised rate of £102.50 per tonne +VAT.

The tenders were assessed by consultants R Robinson & Sons and two companies withdrew their tenders, namely Piperhill Construction Ltd and Noel McQuaid & Sons Ltd due to an arithmetical error.

On the proposal of Councillor McGarvey, seconded by Councillor Quinn it was AGREED to accept the recommendation of the panel that the tender is awarded to M Mallon Contracts at a total cost of up to £92,000+VAT with immediate effect.

4.6 Play Areas Capital Works Budget/Pomeroy Forest

On the proposal of Councillor Quinn, seconded by Councillor McGarvey the Committee RECOMMENDED that tenders are invited in November 2014 for the installation of a play area in Pomeroy Forest; work to be completed by 31 March 2015.

4.7 Improvements to Fairhill Recreation Grounds (Phase II)

The Committee RECOMMENDED that tenders for the necessary capital works for Fairhill Recreation Grounds (Phase II) are invited in November 2014 with immediate effect.

4.8 Leisure Centre – Installation of Standby Generator

On the proposal of Councillor Clarke, seconded by Councillor Glasgow, it was agreed to accept the report and recommendation that H & M Electrics be awarded a contract to install a generator and

carryout associated works for automatic change-over at Cookstown Leisure Centre, at a cost of up to £86,433+VAT.
