Shared Education

Shared Education Signature Project:

- 23 partnerships across 54 schools
- 16 post primary schools
- 36 primary schools
- 1 nursery school
- 1 special school
- Includes controlled, maintained, integrated and Irish medium schools

Peace IV Project

- 12 partnerships across 31 schools
- 28 primary schools
- 2 post primary schools
- 1 special school
- Includes controlled, maintained, integrated and Irish medium schools



Extended Schools Programme

10 clusters involving 28 schools

- 22 primary schools
- 4 post primary schools
- 2 special schools

Neighbourhood Renewal Programme

Coalisland and Dungannon involving 5 post primary schools



Governor Reconstitution

- Approx. 12,000 governors serve in our schools across NI
- Reconstituted every four years
