# The Private Accesses on the A6 Castledawson By-Pass (Stopping-Up) Order (Northern Ireland) 2020

The Department for Infrastructure(a) makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 69(1) of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993(b) and now vested in it(c).

The Department considers that the use of private means of access from the road specified in column (2) of Schedule 1 to the land described in relation thereto in column (3) of that Schedule and three private means of access from the roads specified in column (2) of Schedule 2 to the lands described in relation thereto in column (3) of that Schedule are likely to cause danger to, or interfere unreasonably with, traffic on those roads.

The Department, in accordance with Article 69(2)(a) of that Order, is satisfied that access from the roads to the lands specified in Schedule 1 is not reasonably required.

The Department, in accordance with Article 69(2)(b) of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993, is satisfied that other reasonably convenient means of access to the land specified in Schedule 2 will be provided.

Notice has been published and served in compliance with paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 5 to that Order.

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as The Private Accesses on the A6 Castledawson By-Pass (Stopping-Up) Order (Northern Ireland) 2020 and shall come into operation on 2020.

#### Stopping-up of private accesses

- 2. The private means of access from the length of road specified in column (2) of Schedule 1 to the land specified in relation thereto in column (3) in that Schedule shall be stopped-up to road traffic at the lines specified in that Schedule.
- **3.**—(1) The Department shall carry out such works as it considers necessary for the provision of a new means of access from the road specified in column (1) of Schedule 2 to the lands specified in relation thereto in column (2) of that Schedule.
- (2) On completion of the works referred to in paragraph (1), the private means of access from the road specified in column (1) of the Schedule to the lands specified in relation thereto in column (2) in that Schedule shall be stopped-up to road traffic at the line specified in that Schedule.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order provides for the stopping-up to road traffic of the private accesses on the A6 Castledawson By-Pass from between Castledawson and Toome to the lands detailed in the Schedules.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£1000).

Articles 19 and 69(7) of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993 (S.I. 1993 No. 3160 (N.I. 15)) provide that where access to any land has been stopped-up in pursuance of an order made under Article 69 and any person has suffered damage in consequence thereof by the depreciation of any estate in the land to which he is entitled or by being disturbed in his enjoyment of the land, he shall be entitled to recover from the Department compensation in respect of that damage.

## Stopping-Up of Private Accesses – A6 Castledawson By-Pass

The Department for Infrastructure (DfI) gives notice of its intention to make an Order under Article 69 of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993 ("the 1993 Order") the effect of which would be to stop-up to road traffic the following private accesses:

## Private access to be stopped-up: alternative access to be provided

• **A6 Castledawson Bypass** (Eastbound Carriageway) **Tamniaran** Townland - On the north side of the former A6 Castledawson Bypass at a point 75 metres east of the centre line of Moyola Bridge extending for a distance of 7 metres in an easterly direction.

## Private accesses to be stopped-up: no alternative accesses to be provided

- A6 Castledawson Bypass (Eastbound Carriageway) Tamnadeese Townland – On the north side of the former A6 Castledawson Bypass at a point 255 metres west of the former Annaghmore Road (north) / A6 Castledawson Bypass junction extending for a distance of 5 metres in a westerly direction.
- A6 Castledawson Bypass (Eastbound Carriageway) Annaghmore
   Townland On the north side of the former A6 Castledawson Bypass at
   a point 94 metres east of the former Annaghmore Road (north) / A6
