- Breeding honeybee queens; her offspring is the honeybee colony
- Conservation by promoting the use of the native Irish honeybee in Mid Ulster

Problem with importation of bees

Risk of importing pests and diseases

- Pests
 - Varroa mite since 1990's in Northern Ireland
 - Small hive beetle established in Italy
 - Asian hornet established in France
- Diseases
 - Brood diseases
 - Viruses

BREXIT and the risk of bringing in the small hive beetle

- New regulation since 1st of January, restricts free movement of bees from the EU to GB
- Large honeybee importers now looking to use the NI protocol to import Italian honeybees through NI into GB
- The small hive beetle pest is established in Italy
- The small hive is causing havoc in honeybee hives

How to support our campaign

- Prevent the importation of honeybees
 - Prevent using NI for large scale importing Italian honeybees into UK
 - Preventing every possibility of bringing in the small hive beetle

AND

- Our organisation's aim is to conserve the Native Irish Honeybee
 - Italian bees are a variant of bees which interbreeds with the Native Irish variant
 - Uniquely the native Irish Honeybee is still the dominant honeybee variant in Northern Ireland
