Primary Aim

- Development and expansion of the cross border electric vehicle public charging network to complement the existing TEN-T rapid charger network
- To be achieved by installing 73 rapid chargers in the project region:
- Scotland 24
- N.Ireland 24
- Rep. of Ireland 25
- In addition to the installation of the 73 chargers the project also has a behavioural change element which is led by SWC

Site Selections



- Began with 'long list' of site selections.
- Each Local Authority put forward approx. 10 sites to Ulster University and DKIT
- Following analysis based on range of criteria (L.A. owned land, 24 hour access, proximity to nearest transformer, and other services, safety etc) short list formed
- Short list of sites and reserves approved by Review Group (Departmental reps from Dfl, Dept of Transport R.O.I. and Transport Scotland)

 - 1 x Fast-Charging Unit 60kW
- **✓** Maghera Centre:
 - 1 Fast-Charging Unit 60kW
- ✓ Cookstown Centre:
 - 1 Fast-Charging Unit 60kW









Next Steps




- Procuring N.I. design team
