1.0	Purpose of Report
1.1	To seek agreement to submit the Local Development Plan Strategy to the Department so that those people making representations on the strategy are provided opportunity to represent their views at a Public Examination(IE).
2.0	Background
2.1	To date, the process for publishing the draft Plan Strategy has incorporated the following stages;  Preferred Options Paper (POP) – This was published in November 2016 with a 12 week consultation period which ran until 27th January 2017. There were 657 responses and these were used to inform the draft Plan Strategy.  Paft Plan Strategy (DPS) – Following agreement from Council members on 31st Jan 2019, the DPS was published on 22nd February 2019 followed by an 8 week consultation period. There were 204 representations during the consultation period. These representation were made available to view online and in the three principal offices and a further 8 week consultation period followed to allow for specific policy representations (counter representations) from 14th June 2019 – 9th August 2019. There were a total of 214 counter-representations received. All representations and counter representations were considered and collated in consultation reports, which were agreed by Planning Committee over 3 separate meetings between November 2019 –
	January 2020.

Re-Consultation Exercise – Following the discovery of a procedural error in the consultation process, a re-consultation on the Draft Plan Strategy was launched for the period of 25<sup>th</sup> March 2020 – 21<sup>st</sup> May 2020. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and closure of Councils buildings, this consultation period was extended until 24<sup>th</sup> September 2020 meaning that there was a 6 month re-consultation period. A total of 36 additional representations were received. Again, all representations were placed on display in the three principal council offices and the Council website and subject to another counter representation consultation period between 22<sup>nd</sup> October and 18<sup>th</sup> December 2020. An additional 14 counter representations were received. The updated public consultation report with the additional representations and counter representations was agreed by Planning Committee on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2021.

## 3.0 Main report

#### 3.1 Main Issues

Council have already agreed the contents of the draft Plan Strategy. The most noteworthy and important elements of the contents of the DPS are summarised below;

- Additional scope for rural housing through an enhanced list of criteria whereby development of single dwellings may be appropriate. This is to reflect the existing rural settlement patterns in Mid Ulster and to support our vibrant rural communities
- Additional scope for economic development in the rural area in order to reflect the current make up of our District i.e. we have a considerable degree of rural industry / entrepreneurship; particularly in manufacturing.
- > Enhanced protection for our most vulnerable landscapes through additional designations which include;
  - Special Countryside Area (SCA)
  - Area of Constraint on Mineral Development (ACMD) designation and
  - Area of Constraint on Wind Turbines and High Structures (AOCWTHS) designation.

These designations are focussed on the High Sperrins, the Brougher Mountain Escarpment overlooking the Clogher Valley, Slieve Beagh and the shoreline of Lough Neagh and Lough Beg.

## 3.2 Consultation Responses

A summary of the main issues, which were raised during the consultation period for the DPS, include the following;

#### Rural Housing

3.3

Unsurprisingly, Dfl have registered strong objections to our proposed rural housing policy. They argue that we are facilitating more rural housing which goes against regional planning policy which encourages people to live in towns and cities as opposed to more unsustainable forms of living such as rural dwellings.

The Councils position is that policies are tailored to our district and they support our vibrant rural communities, allowing them to survive and continue to grow, something that is also reflected in regional planning policy. In doing so, we are also capable of fulfilling the RDS target of 60% of new houses to be located in the hub settlements, as shown in Appendix 1 of the draft Plan Strategy. In effort to ensure rural house building does not exceed existing levels, we have incorporated a review mechanism to monitor levels.

## 3.4 <u>Landscape Character Assessment Review</u>

Dfl have also raised concerns regarding the Landscape Character Assessment (LCA) Review which was carried out to inform the strategic environmental designations brought forward in the DPS and already referenced in this report. The Council considers that the approach taken to its LCA Review is sound. The Council has relied on the robust pre-existing data sources which have been updated as necessary and the Council considers this is an approach which has been relied on elsewhere with success. Furthermore, GM Design Associates, a well respected consultancy, were employed by the Council to carry out an audit of the LCA Review. GM Design Associates and the Council planning department are content that the issues identified throughout their audit process resulted in appropriate amendments and that the resulting LCA Review is a more comprehensive and sound document.

A paper defending the approach taken to Landscape Review has been approved by planning committee in March 2021 and will be uploaded to the Council website as supporting documentation to the DPS.

## 3.5 Mining

In order to protect local communities and important landscapes the Plan Strategy proposes greater protection against inappropriate minerals development, particularly in the Sperrins. This is a subject on which there are very strong and competing views and a public examination is needed to allow everyone to have their say.

#### **3.6** Renewable Energy

The Renewable Energy industry have raised concern that the strategic designations brought forward in the DPS will restrict potential for renewable energy development. The Councils position on this is that Northern Ireland as a country is on course to meet our renewable energy targets, (albeit this will kept under review) and that Mid Ulster is a significant contributor to this achievement. In addition to this, we have to balance the need for further renewable energy with a need to protect our vulnerable landscapes such as the high Sperrins, Slieve Beagh, Brougher Mountain etc. from inappropriate development.

#### 3.7 Moving Forward

The need to re-run our consultation process and to extend it due to covid-19 has meant that the process of progressing the DPS has become somewhat protracted. Consequently, we consider it expedient to ensure that stakeholders who have made a representation or counter representation to the DPS, have their views heard at Independent Examination as soon as possible.

3.8 All issues raised during the consultation periods have been presented to and agreed by the Planning Committee and the DPS Consultation Report will be

uploaded to the Council website as part of the process of submission. The DPS Consultation Report will not be published on the Council website until submission of the DPS for IE. It can therefore be viewed via the link below:

#### 3.13 Minor Corrections to DPS.

Following submission of the DPS, the Department will either direct the Council to withdraw the DPS or will cause an Independent Examination to be held by the Planning Appeals Commission. It is strongly expected that the latter option will be adopted and that an Independent Examination will be caused.

It is anticipated that as is normal practice, the Independent Examination will compel the Council to make some changes prior to adoption of the Strategy in its final form. Following adoption, the next stage of the Local Development Plan process will be to advance with the Local Policies Plan which will consider site specific issues such as land use zonings and the extent of development settlement limits for each settlement. Members should be advised that there is no pressing issues of land shortages, and in that regard, extant zonings in the 3 legacy Area Plans are deemed sufficient to cater for the District in the intervening period.
